QUAKER SERVICE IN A TIME OF WAR

Brighton Friends Meeting House will host a major exhibition on Quaker service in two World Wars, coinciding with the centenary of WWI and Quaker peace work in Africa.

For over 350 years, the aim of the Quaker community has been to affirm 'that of God' in everyone: violence and warfare were and are against their basic spiritual convictions. The Quakers have developed ways not only of opposing warfare, but also of actively working for peace. WWI saw many Quakers imprisoned as conscientious objectors. Others worked in the Friends Ambulance Unit or for the Victims Relief Committee. Some enlisted believing it to be a just war, some were disowned for taking this view, but this was not universal. Quakers believe that warfare is against the will of God, who is a God of peace.

Today many Quakers work towards reconciliation, the reduction of armaments, and the adoption of methods to overcome future wars.
