and Reconciliation. The goal is to acknowledge
the narrative of the other through encounters
between bereaved families, both Palestinian
and Israeli in their homes and neighbourhoods.

can they begin to accept the reality that their
colleagues express?*

The Quaker Open House for Palestine and
Israel has been launched by local Quakers to
find practical ways of respecting the common
humanity in all people, whatever their religious
or non-religious backgrounds. We wish to offer
