In total contrast... on March 27th police broke into the Westminster Quaker Meeting House and arrested six young people who were holding a meeting about climate change and the current problems in Gaza. The use of force was unprecedented, doors were damaged and tasers and handcuffs were used. Grave concern was voiced about this misuse of power by the Metropolitan

Police Service; since then we have held an excellent meeting with Sussex Police, and are confident that such a scenario would be much less likely in our City. The statement we issued about this debacle appears below.

This joyous and celebratory gathering was held last year at Amex Stadium and was such an outstanding success that it will be repeated again this year. The event & parking at venue is FREE and open to all our diverse communities and all inter-faith groups. It will involve reciting Sikh Paath (prayers) and singing Shabad Kirtan (hymns) followed by Langar (FREE vegetarian food) for all attendees.

Note: It is required as a sign of respect and humility, during Paath & Shabad Kirtan the sangat (congregation) wear head-covering (eg bring Handkerchief/Scarf) and remove shoes and observe guidelines similar to visiting a Gurdwara.



## Statement from the IFCG following the Incident at the Westminster Quaker House on March 27th 2025

The Interfaith Contact Group of Brighton and Hove (IFCG), wishes to voice its utter condemnation of the violation of The Westminster Quaker Meeting House on the night of March 27<sup>th</sup>. The IFCG includes representatives of around 30 different faith Groups, faith leaders and 300 'friends' representing people of faith and none in Brighton and Hove and Sussex.

The remit of the IFCG is to create safe spaces and opportunities for people of faith to meet in freedom. A significant number of our committee are Quakers, as are many of our friends. The ethos of peace is fundamental to the Quaker community, and their contribution empowers the IFCG to interact harmoniously with people of diverse faiths and cultures in Brighton, Hove and Sussex, including the City's occupants, visitors, refugees and the homeless.

In a world where freedom of faith and expression are not allowed in many countries and acts of violence against racial and cultural minorities are condemned by our Government, this ugly gesture of aggression is unacceptable. The Government and the MET cannot hide behind the Public Order Act of 2023 to carry out acts of assault against young people simply carrying out a meeting in a sacred place of worship. The use of tasers and equipment to break down doors and subsequently handcuff people in a sacred space is reminiscent of the darkest days of the worst political regimes; such measures must never be tolerated in the United Kingdom.

In the months to come the IFCG will continue to stand in support of The Friends and the ethos of peace fundamental to The Meeting House and those that worship there. We will always give our heartfelt support for the Quakers commitment to freedom of expression, and the right to state ideas in a peaceful and honourable way.
