

A Time to Heal




'To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven...'

I have never opened this newsletter with a quotation from a scripture, but this time it just seems so apt to quote Ecclesiastes 3. In this timeless text, spoken at so many funerals, we are reminded that 'To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under heaven...' and two verses later it reminds us that there is 'a time to heal', and this has never been so true. It has to be a time to heal, and in view of the terrible violence taking place in Ukraine, Gaza, and recently in our own country - in Manchester - we cannot deny that this must be 'a time to heal.'

Six months ago the committee of the IFCG decided that the next interfaith service for the City should be dedicated to the theme 'Nurturing Peace'. The decision was taken unanimously by individuals from our Buddhist, Baha'i, Brahma Kumari, Church of England, Jewish, Methodist, Pagan, Quaker and Atheist communities. The decision was taken in full agreement – in the harmonious and respectful spirit of understanding, by a very diverse group.

And just as this must be a 'time to heal' so must this be a 'time for interfaith', for healing and understanding by our diverse communities, and our world.




A Tale of Two Chaplains

Urgent! Brighton and Hove Libraries Now Under Threat!

The Network of International Women for Brighton and Hove meet every week at the Jubilee Library, and here, women of all ethnicities, cultures, races and faiths talk about life, share creative projects and ideas on a wide variety of issues. These meetings are important. Our libraries are important, and we need them.

Apart from several attempts to get rid of Hove Library, the Council has managed to hang on to its libraries, until now. But now Rottingdean, Hollingbury and Westdene are all facing forced closure. The belief is that if the Council can close these they will proceed to get rid of many more. Libraries are vital community hubs where people meet, and people develop. They serve as meeting places, places of warmth in winter, but above all places of learning and discovery. The Council's decision to implement the closures is apparently scheduled for Friday, October 10th. Time is running out. The following libraries will be closed permanently:

Hollingbury, Rottingdean and Westdene. Jubilee Library - the jewel in our crown - will have reduced opening hours.

For those who risk their lives each day for peace, May their hearts glimpse providence at the heart of history.


That those who make riches from violence and war Might hear in their dreams to cries of the lost.
